An honest insight into people on the edge of society, excluded, trying to find personal and collective unity.



A bleak, contemplative film, shot in beautiful black and white by cinematographer Martin Schafer who transforms the Bristol locations. The devastating final moments mark the advent of Thatcherism and the termination of all the Sixties' dreams of freedom and escape. Radio On is driven by a powerful electronic, post-punk soundtrack including Kraftwerk (see Treutonium) and David Bowie's Heroes.
