Using mime, slide projections of the original illustrations from the book, a narrator, movie projections, special lighting and sound effects, and even smells, the 'The Land Where Scientifically Valuable Minerals Form.' attempts a more general appeal to the audience's senses than conventional theatrical practice, and indeed this method of presentation could well be termed "theatre of senses".
